- 1. **Sheep** can see behind them without having to turn around, as their eyes are at the side of their head.

- 9. A shepherd in Ethiopia was resting when he saw his goats dancing around. He realised the goats were getting their dancing powers from a little fruit they had been eating. That little fruit was actually a coffee bean and since then **coffee** has been used all around the world.
- 10. Cashmere goats produce **cashmere** wool. Angora goats produce mohair wool.
- 11. Australia is the leading exporter of goat meat in the world.

- 14. The world record for a rabbit jump is 1 metre.
